# **Trust and Estate Corner**

Creditor's don't just have 7 months to collect claims against a decedent's estate. There is a common misconception that if creditors don't make a claim within 7 months of the decedent's death, that their claims are no longer valid and can be ignored. However, the actual rule (SCPA §1802) provides that if no claim or notice is made within 7 months of the issuance of letters of appointment "the fiduciary shall not be chargeable for any assets or moneys that he may have paid in good faith in satisfaction of any lawful claims or of any legacies or distributions to the legatees or distributees of the decedent before such claim was presented." Thus, the creditor claim is not invalid if it is presented after a 7 month period, but rather the fiduciary can not be held personally liable for assets distribute after 7 months, if no valid claims have been presented.

# EXPANSION OF MANDATORY E-FILING PROGRAM (NYSCEF) WESTCHESTER COUNTY SUPREME COURT

Chief Administrative Judge Lawrence K. Marks has sent out a notice proposing expansion of the mandatory E-Filing program within the 9th Judicial District – Westchester County Supreme Court for all civil matters with the exception of CPLR Art 70 proceedings, CPLR Art. 78 proceedings; Election Law proceedings, matrimonial matters and MHL matters. # HISTORICAL EXHIBIT AT THE NEW ROCHELLE FAMILY COURT

The Lemmon Enslave Rescue Case

From Nov. 15 thru Nov. 24, a traveling historic exhibit was located at the New Rochelle Family Court, 26 Garden Street which tells the story of the Lemmon Enslave rescue case. The Lemmon case is a series of 1850s decisions by the New York Courts that ordered the release of 8 enslaved people including 6 children who were brought into New York by their Virginia owners while in transit to Texas. The Court of Appeals ruling in that case was in direct conflict with the Supreme Courts infamous Dred Scott decision of 1857 and it represented one of the most unyielding anti-slavery decisions made by any Court in the United State prior to the Civil War.

The exhibit was made possible by the Historical Society on the New York Courts and featured a short documentary narrated by James Earl Jones that brings to life the lawyers, judges and ordinary New Yorkers, including many African American, who helped rescue and represent the 8 enslaved people. The Lemmon Exhibit will travel to 45 Courthouses in every judicial district.
